










NHS CAREERS EVENT AT THE UNIVERSITY OF LINCOLN

On Wednesday, 24 Year 10 pupils from Child Development and BTEC Sport visited the University of Lincoln to take part in the annual NHS Careers Event. Pupils took part in interactive Health and Social Care workshops, as well as a hands -on Midwifery workshop, each offering valuable insight into the skills and pathways associated with these professions. Literacy Focus w/c 24.11.2025 Commas for Connective Openers

As part of our whole-school literacy drive, our focus for the week commencing Monday 24th November will be on using commas for connective openers. Pupils will be revisiting how to begin sentences with a connective or connective phrase, using a comma to separate this introductory element from the main clause.

For example: "However, many pupils felt confident with the task."

This focus will help pupils add cohesion to their writing, link ideas more effectively, and improve the overall flow of their work. Staff will be encouraging pupils to identify, practise, and apply this technique across all subjects, supporting the development of

confident, accurate, and well-structured written work.
