

## The New School Day

Based on parental feedback and our own review of procedures, we will be implementing changes to the structure of the school day. While start and finish times will remain unchanged, we will introduce a morning registration period and reverse the order of registration and period 5 in the afternoon. This adjustment aims to ensure pupils are prepared for their lessons, while allowing for key messages to be effectively communicated. The amended school day will be structured as follows:

Form Time: 08:50 - 09:00

Period 1: 09:00 - 10:00

Period 2: 10:00 - 11:00

Break: 11:00 - 11:20

Period 3: 11:20 - 12:20

Period 4: 12:20 - 13:20

Lunch: 13:20 - 14:00

Period 5: 14:00 - 15:00

Form Time: 15:00 - 15:20

#### RE: Changes to Behaviour Management Procedures – September 2025

I am writing to inform you of an important update to our behaviour management system that will take effect from the start of the new academic year in September.

As part of our ongoing efforts to create a calm, supportive, and focused learning environment, we will be making changes to the way we manage low-level disruptions and behaviour concerns in the classroom.

From September, pupils who need support to refocus will now do so **within the classroom**. This may involve a change of seating or a short period of reflective time at an alternative desk in the room. This approach aims to minimise disruption to learning while helping pupils to regulate their behaviour in a calm, familiar setting.

We have made this decision following a review of our current practices and evidence showing that removing pupils from the classroom can sometimes lead to further dysregulation. By keeping pupils in the room, we are better able to support them in re-engaging with their learning quickly and positively.

Our staff will receive appropriate training to ensure this approach is implemented consistently and with sensitivity to individual needs. As always, we will continue to work closely with parents and carers to support positive behaviour and wellbeing.

Dear Parent/Carer

RE: Important Update: Out-of-Lesson and Toilet Pass Policy from September, 2025

We are writing to inform you of an important change to our school policy regarding pupil movement during lesson time. From September 2025, we will no longer be issuing general out-of-lesson passes, and toilet passes will only be granted with appropriate medical evidence. Out of lesson passes include: Time Out Pass, Early Lesson Exit Pass, Link Room Pass, Movement Break Pass, Trusted Adult Pass, etc. Rest assured, pupils with a Link Room Pass provision in their care plan will have this provision honoured.

This decision has been made following a review of current practices and their impact on learning. We have found that an increasing number of pupils are using these passes to **avoid lessons** or engage in **unnecessary movement around the school**, which disrupts their own education as well as that of others.

To support a calm, focused learning environment for all pupils, the new policy will be as follows:

- Out-of-lesson passes will no longer be routinely issued. Pupils will be expected to remain in class unless there is a specific, pre-arranged reason that has been approved by a member of staff.
- Toilet passes will only be issued to pupils with a diagnosed medical condition that requires frequent or urgent use of the toilet. In these cases, we ask that you provide supporting medical documentation for our records.

We understand that genuine needs may arise, and staff will continue to use their discretion in exceptional circumstances. However, we ask for your support in reinforcing to your child the importance of remaining in lessons and making use of break and lunchtime facilities wherever possible.

If you have any concerns or require further information, please do not hesitate to contact the school.
