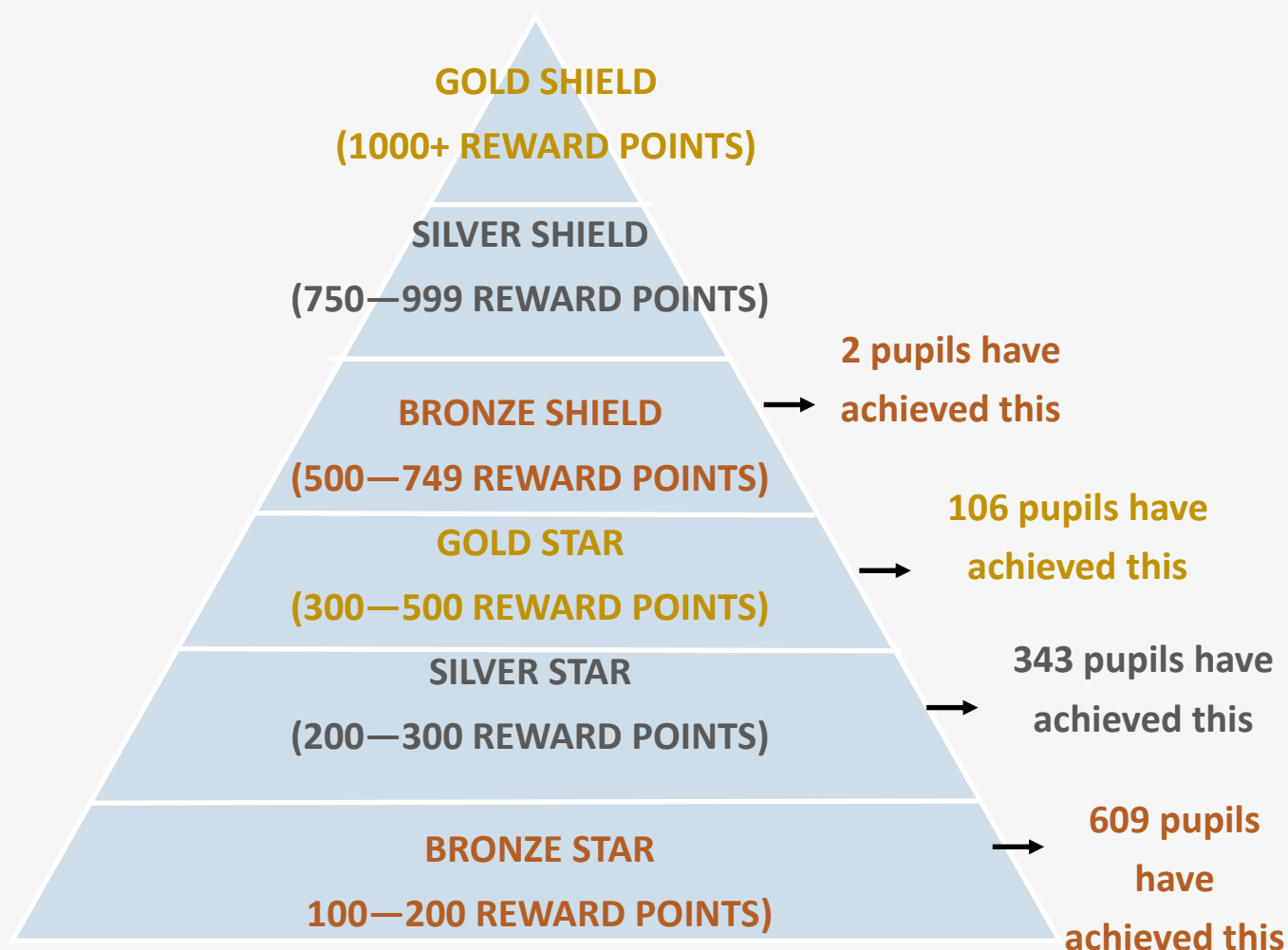

Literacy Focus w/c 15.12.2025

Wandering vs Wondering

As part of our ongoing whole-school literacy drive, the focus for the week commencing 15th December will be on the commonly confused words wandering and wondering. Pupils will be revisiting the difference between these homophones—wandering, meaning to move about without a fixed course, and wondering, meaning to think or be curious about something.

For example: “While she was wondering what to read next, her brother was wandering around the library looking for his favourite section.”

This focus will support pupils in improving accuracy, strengthening vocabulary choices, and enhancing clarity in their writing. Staff are encouraged to provide regular opportunities for pupils to identify, practise, and apply this understanding across the curriculum, helping to develop confident, precise and well-structured written work.
