Mock Court Trial Success!

Twelve pupils from Years 8 and 9 took part in the Young Citizens Mock Court Trial Competition at Nottingham Justice Centre on Saturday 14th March.

Having worked on a fictitious case since November, the team prepared both prosecution and defence arguments, competing against five other schools. Pupils took on a range of roles including lawyers, witnesses, legal advisors, magistrates and court usher, demonstrating impressive commitment and teamwork throughout.

Supported by UALS staff and visiting magistrates, the team performed exceptionally well, narrowly missing out to the eventual winners. The experience provided a valuable insight into how the legal system operates and may inspire some students to pursue a future career in law.

In addition, Lilla has been recognized by the WSSA International Board as part of the Top Global Stackers (TGS) Program. This prestigious program highlights the fastest and most accomplished sport stackers worldwide. For the 2024–2025 season, Lilla is ranked third fastest female stacker in the United Kingdom, placing her among the Top 5 UK Female Stackers.

As a TGS member, she received a certificate and an exclusive commemorative TGS season bundle, including a custom stacking mat and cup set—awarded only to top-ranked athletes.

LITERACY FOCUS

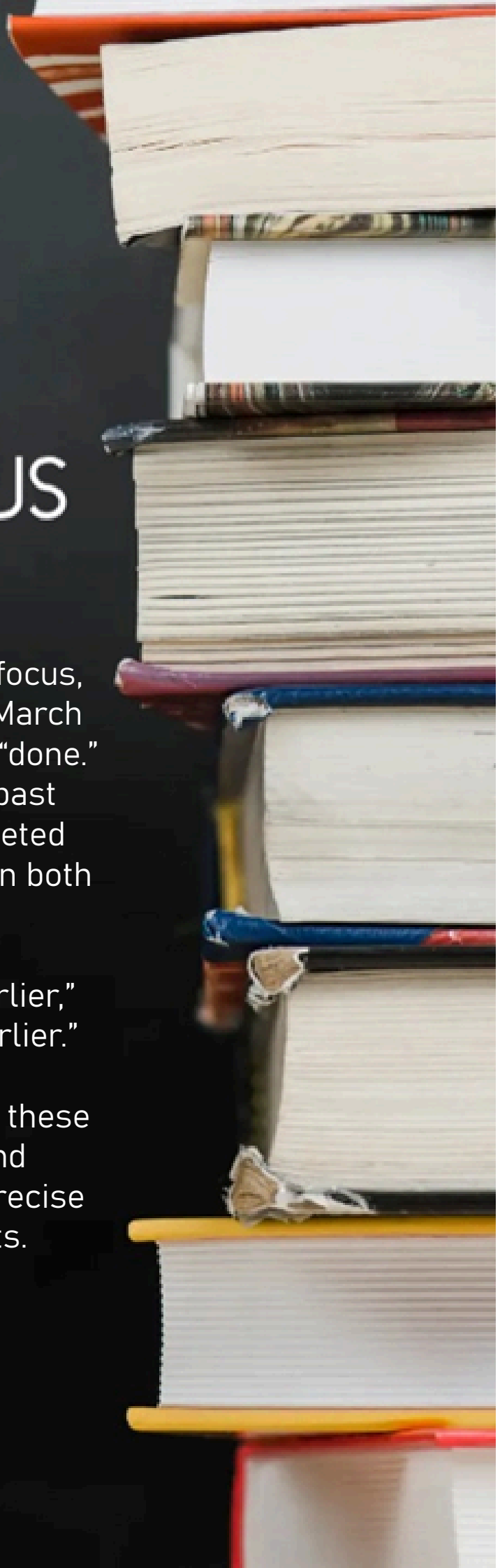
Did and Done

As part of our whole-school literacy focus, the week commencing Monday 23rd March highlights the correct use of “did” and “done.”

Pupils explore how to use “did” for past actions and “done” to indicate completed actions, helping to improve accuracy in both spoken and written English.

This focus encourages pupils to apply these forms correctly in their writing and speaking, supporting clearer, more precise communication across all subjects.
